#### RESET

Perform reset procedure when using the Personal Organizer for the first time. Reset deletes all data including the secret password if used.

Press reset button on the back of the unit with a small instrument, "RESET?" will show on the display.

Press ENTER to delete all data.

#### LANGUAGE

7 languages can be displayed:ENGLISH, SPANISH, FRENCH, GERMAN, ITALIAN, PORTUGUESE and DUTCH.

After reset, the characters on the display will return to English
